Position Description

Cashier: Greet customers, take order, process order on a touch screen POS System, accept payment and give change and receipt.

Ice Cream Sales: Prepare and serve ice cream products to the public at a seasonal (May through August) ice cream shop. Work will be available from May until September.

Ice Cream Maker: Training will be provided in making ice cream with a 20 quart batch freezer. Ice cream will be made daily to be served at the ice cream shop. Hours will be approximately 7:00 AM to 3:00 PM. Prior kitchen/cooking experience is desirable and heavy lifting and upper body strength is required. Hourly wage will increase as work proficiency increases.

Housing

I will communicate with you via email to determine what sort of housing you are interested in and whether you are interested in sharing an apartment with other J-1 workers. In April I will begin to search for specific housing options and let you know what is available for May through August. The cost of housing can have a wide range depending upon the type of housing. At this point I am estimating the cost at \$150.00 per person per week. I will be able to post more accurate information as we get closer to May.
