Participants are ambassadors of their home country and should make every effort to represent their country well. Please Note: Friends and couples are welcome to apply, however, they should not expect to be assigned the same shift or be granted the same days off.

There are 12 bathrooms in the housing, and there is a shared sitting room with a TV and a shared kitchen. The employer will provide some kitchenware for participants to cook. WiFi is available at no additional cost, and there is a laundromat nearby which participants can access. Participants can move in up to 2 days prior to their DS-2019 Start Date. Participants must move out by the Sunday following their DS-2019 End Date. While the housing is reserved for Work and Travel participants, some seasonal American employees may be living in the housing.

As a dishwasher, participants are primarily responsible for cleaning dishware and maintaining supplies. Dishwasher job duties include: • Washing and cleaning glassware, silverware, dishes, cooking utensils and supplies • Ensuring the dish room and dishes, glasses, etc. are organized and easy to locate • Supporting other staff as assigned with basic responsibilities such as cleaning and replenishing supplies Dishwasher requirements: * Must be able to lift large pots up to 50 pounds * Must be able to stand for extended periods of time (up to 8 hours) * Must be able to withstand frequent stooping, bending and lifting * Must be able to wear synthetic or latex gloves * Must be able to follow verbal instructions On the cleaning and set-up crew, participants are responsible for early morning cleaning, preparation for opening, and daily event set-up including room configuration, place settings, and other tasks as assigned. Cleaning and set-up job duties include: • Vacuuming, dusting, mopping and sweeping • Polishing doors and other metal surfaces • Bathroom cleaning • General cleaning • Taking out the garbage • Refreshing paper goods • Moving tables and chairs • Configuring rooms for parties • Setting tables • Light landscaping Cleaning and set-up crew requirements: * Must be able to withstand cold temperatures (0 degrees F or less) and hot temperatures (100 degrees F or more) for 30 minutes or more, when working with a dishwashing machine or in a walk-in freezer * Must be able to move 50 lbs distances of up to 100 ft * Must understand and respond to verbal requests and visual cues in a loud and extremely busy environment * Must be able to walk and stand for periods up to 5 hours * Must not be allergic to general cleaning supplies or their odors. Participants will be using cleaning chemicals. Primary job duties are represented. Other duties may be assigned.

Job description

The primary responsibility of a server is to take customers' orders and serve food and beverages. Job duties also include escorting guests to tables, light set-up of rooms and cocktail stations, serving customers seated at counters, and setting up and clearing tables. They also check the identification of patrons to ensure they meet the minimum age requirement for the purchase of alcohol. Servers must be professional, polite, and reliable, and they must be able to learn and describe food proficiently. Please Note: In the State of NY, employees must be 18 years old to serve alcohol, however, 21 years old to consume alcohol. Additional job duties include: • Checking with customers to ensure they are enjoying their meals and taking action to correct any problems • Explaining how various menu items are prepared, describing ingredients and cooking methods • Presenting menus to patrons, answering questions about menu items, making recommendations upon request • Removing dishes and glasses from tables and taking them to the kitchen for cleaning • Serving food and/or beverages to patrons, preparing and serving specialty dishes at tables as required • Stocking service areas with supplies such as coffee, food, tableware, and linens • Adhering to company policy and State and Federal regulations regarding service of alcohol Server requirements: * Must be able to stand and exert well-paced mobility for up to 4 hours in length and in limited space * Must have the ability to bend, squat and lift up to 50 lbs, including but not limited to lifting trays of food or food items on a regular and continuing basis * Must understand and respond to employee and guests' verbal requests and visual cues in a loud and extremely busy environment * Must not be allergic to general cleaning supplies and their odors as participants will be using cleaning chemicals Job description continued in the 'Additional Comments' section at the end of this agreement.
